At Habitat for Humanity of Greater Plymouth, every home we build lays the foundation for brighter futures—not only for the families we serve but for the entire community. This year, our Affordable Housing Development Program ramped up with the completion of a 3-bedroom home at 47 Indian Ave and the start of our next complete rehabilitation project at 597 Wareham Rd, both in Plymouth.

This spring, Marcus, Rachel, and their children, Aaliyah and Aubrey, moved into their new home on Indian Ave, marking the end of a journey built on hard work and community support. Now, Jacquelyn and her daughter Fallyn begin their own path to homeownership at 597 Wareham Rd, with the promise of a stable future ahead. Jacquelyn's soon-to-be home marks the first time we're building a 2-bedroom home to meet the needs of smaller families.

Through our build program, we create opportunities for families to achieve strength and stability while fostering connections in the towns we serve—Plymouth, Plympton, Middleboro, Carver, Lakeville, and Kingston. Volunteers are at the heart of this mission, dedicating their time and skills to transform lives and neighborhoods.

Affordable housing changes everything. It empowers families, strengthens communities, and builds hope for generations. Together, we are not just constructing houses but creating stronger foundations for a brighter tomorrow.

ReStore on the Rise

This year marked an exciting milestone for the Habitat ReStore with the implementation of a new point-of-sale (POS) system, funded in part by a grant from the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection. This cutting-edge system has streamlined operations, making it easier to track inventory, process donations, and serve customers more efficiently. By improving processes, the ReStore is now better equipped to repurpose more items, reduce waste, keep even more goods out of landfills, and help us deliver affordable housing to the community.

This new system includes a “round up” donation feature, offering customers the opportunity to further support our efforts by rounding up their purchase by just a few cents or a few dollars at a time. Since the implementation of this system in August, we have received \$450+ in round up donations.

This year, our Cabinet Deconstruction Program has resulted in 12 sets of cabinets kept out of the landfills and given second life for the lucky buyers. We are working hard to continue to spread the word of this fantastic program, so please contact us if you you’re remodeling and would like us to dismantle, remove, and resell your cabinets in support of a good cause!

As we work to grow our impact, we are seeking volunteers to serve on our ReStore Ambassador crew, spreading the word throughout the community of this social enterprise and how it supports our mission.
